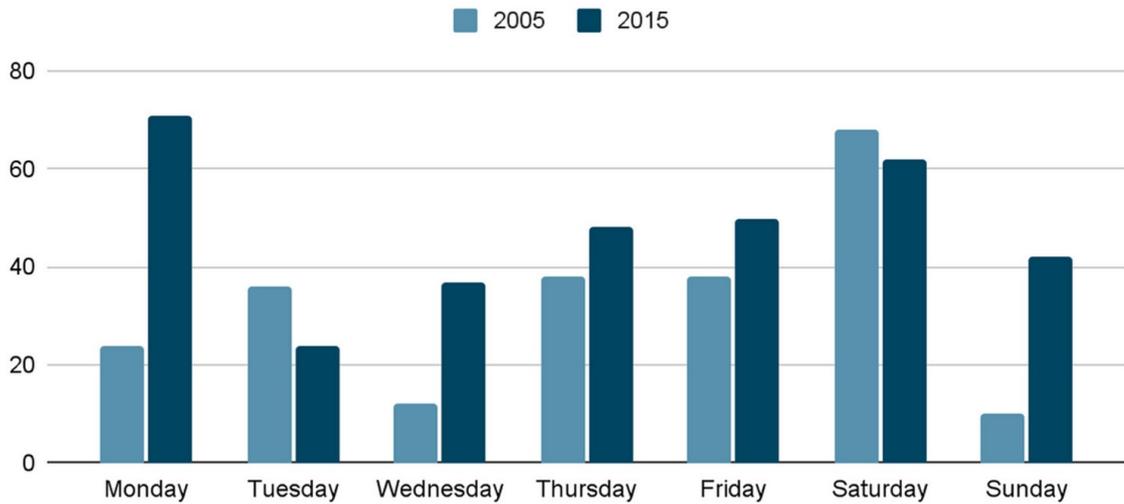
Part A: Read the task below.

This report describes the difference in the pairs of footwear sold between 2005 and 2015 for a shoe shop.

Overall, we have seen a general \_\_\_\_\_<sup>1</sup> in trade on all days with the \_\_\_\_\_<sup>2</sup> of Tuesday and Saturday when there has been a decrease.

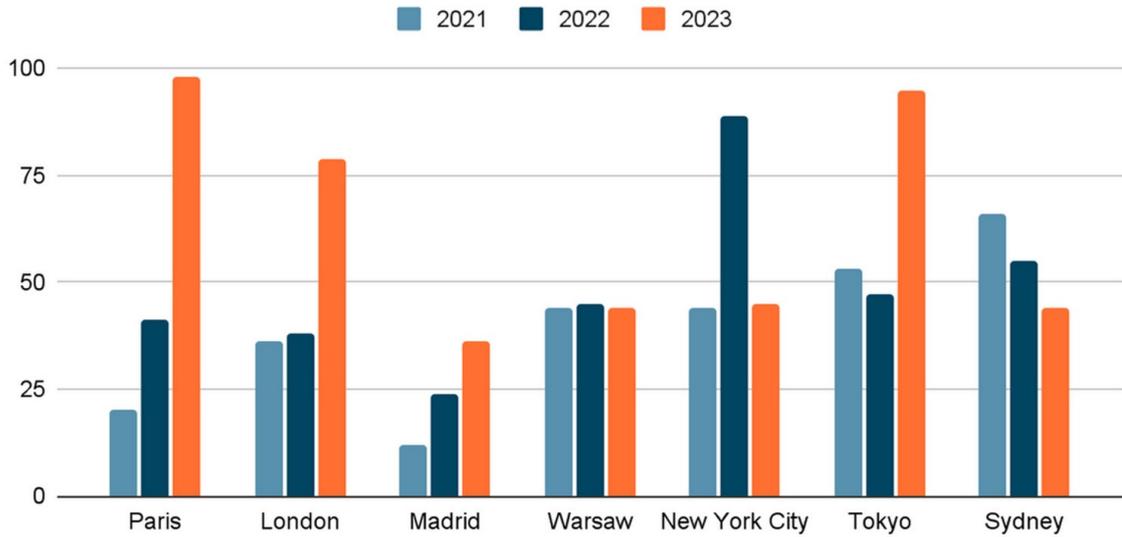
The most \_\_\_\_\_<sup>3</sup> growth has been on Sundays when sales have almost \_\_\_\_\_<sup>4</sup>. On the whole, midweek sales have increased \_\_\_\_\_<sup>5</sup>, though this is offset somewhat by a slight \_\_\_\_\_<sup>6</sup> in Saturday sales. This is presumably because more people are shopping all week rather than leaving the majority of their shopping until the weekend. The report describes the difference in sales between seven different regions over a period of three years.

The strongest overall performer was \_\_\_\_\_<sup>1</sup> which saw its profits \_\_\_\_\_<sup>2</sup> each year. By contrast, the poorest performer was \_\_\_\_\_<sup>3</sup>, however, there has been a \_\_\_\_\_<sup>4</sup> increase in profits in this region. 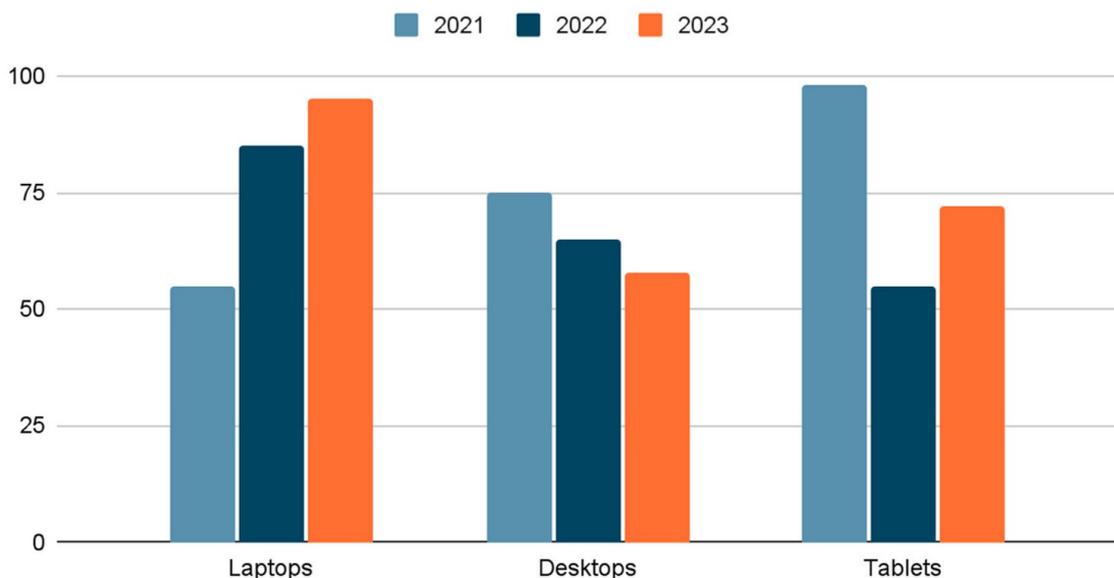
